T. M. Wingo Dies Suddenly While On Fishing Trip

T. M. Wingo, businessman who resided at 4115 Trowbridge street, died suddenly at Elephant Butte lake early today. He had gone there on a fishing trip with his son, Lowdon.

He was 74. He had lived in El Paso 47 years.

He was born in Pauld County, Ga. As a child he lived in the Indian Territory, now Oklahoma.

He came to El Paso in 1901 and founded the Lowden National Bank. He also founded the Wingo Insurance Service at 311 Texas street.

Winchester Cooley and R. B. Kimbrough were associated with him in the insurance business until 1946.

Mr. Wingo was the last surviving member of the original board of directors of the Toltec Club. He was one of the organizers of the El Paso Country Club. He also was a member of the Fin and Feather Club, a sportsmen's organization at Pecos. His hobby was trout fishing.

Mr. and Mrs. Wingo celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in December, 1944.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Elena Wingo; a son, Lowdon, a daughter, Mrs. Emmett Aiken of Beverly Hills, Calif.; a sister, Mrs. Ona Merrill of Montgomery, Ala.; a brother, Harrington G. Wingo of Stillwater, Fla.; and three grandchildren.

Funeral arrangements are pending with Kaster and Maxon.
