

DEATH TAKES C. B. WOODUL

Lieutenant Governor's Uncle
Had Lived in El Paso
For 18 Years

C. B. Woodul, president of the Woodul Coal Co., and a resident of El Paso for 18 years, died today at his home at 3127 Federal St. He was 58.

He had been in ill health for several years.

Mr. Woodul was an uncle of Walter Woodul, Lieutenant Governor of Texas. He was one of the most active members of the First Christian Church for years. He was a deacon in the church.

Until his health failed, Mr. Woodul played every year in the baseball game between the Rotary and Kiwanis Clubs for the benefit of The Times Milk Fund.

Mr. Woodul also was the El Paso representative of the Cia Fundidora de Fierro y Acero de Monterrey.

Mr. Woodul is survived by his widow, Mrs. Mary Woodul; a daughter, Mary Bess; three sons, William D. and Harold, both of El Paso, and Lewis C.
