

Pioneer El Pasoan Claimed By Death

The body of Thomas W. Zimpleman, pioneer El Pasoan who died Thursday night at his home, 2829 Louisville street, was sent to Austin, Texas, Friday to be buried in the family plot there.

Mr. Zimpleman, who was 70 years old, had been a resident of El Paso for 50 years. He had been ill for nearly a year. Death resulted from heart trouble.

The Zimpleman family has been prominent in El Paso for many years. Maj. George B. Zimpleman, father of Thomas W. Zimpleman, at one time was one of the largest land owners in this district.

During the 50 years Mr. Zimpleman was a resident of El Paso, he engaged in many business activities. For the last 10 years, however, he had retired. He is survived by his widow.
