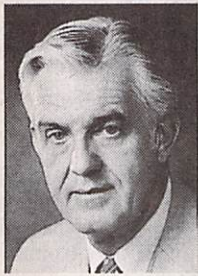

Philip Townsend Cole, former United States Magistrate Judge, died Tuesday, November 11, 2003 at age 74. Judge Cole was a lifelong resident of El Paso, graduating from Austin High School, Texas Western College (UTEP) and the University of Texas Law School. While at UT Law School, Judge Cole was elected to the Law Review, and graduated with honors. Judge Cole served as assistant county attorney, was a partner in the law firm of Brewster, Hoy and Cole, in solo practice, and was counsel for the Public Service Board. He was appointed United States Magistrate Judge in 1980, retiring in 1994. Judge Cole is survived by his wife, Anne Morrissey Cole; daughter

er Carolyn Cole of Westcliffe, Colorado; son David Cole and wife Shauna, granddaughters Breanne and Parker, all of Fort Worth; sister Sharon Sloan and husband Matt of El Paso. # Magistrate dies at 74, is known for integrity

A memorial service will take place Saturday for retired U.S. Magistrate Philip T. Cole, who died on Tuesday, his wife said.

Cole, 74, was a U.S. magistrate in El Paso from 1980 until retiring in 1994. He is survived by his wife, Anne Morrissey Cole, two children and two grandchildren.

"He was the most honest man I knew, and he always had a joke," his wife said.

The cause of death was not disclosed by the family.

The memorial will be at 4 p.m. Saturday at his former law office at 1011 N. Mesa, Morrissey Cole said.

Philip Cole, a former El Paso Times copy boy, was a graduate of Austin High School, newspaper archives said. He graduated in 1951 from Texas Western College, now UTEP.

He was an investigator with the U.S. Treasury Department before entering the University of Texas law school. He was named assistant county attorney.

He was sworn in as a part-time U.S. magistrate in 1980. In 1983, he was sworn in as a full-time magistrate by U.S. District Judge Harry Lee Hudspeth.
