# Adams owned trailer park

William Arnold "W.A." Adams Jr., owner of Robin Hood Trailer Park, founder of the Del Camino Bullfight Museum and an Army colonel with the 7th Cavalry in World War II, died Friday (Feb. 24, 1995). He was 79 and had lived in El Paso all his life.

He also was a former rancher and former owner of Del Camino Courts.

Survivors include his wife, Margo; his sons, Paul C. Teas III and John L. Teas; and his daughters, Katie Adams Chauvet, Barbara Adams Hutson and Peggy Adams McInterff.

W.A. ADAMS, JR. (WILLIAM ARNOLD) 79, passed away February 24, 1995. He was a life long resident of El Paso, attended New Mexico Military Institute, graduated from Texas A & M with a BA in Engineering. He served in World War II as a Colonel with the 7th Cavalry Division. He was a former rancher, owner of Robin Hood Trailer Park, former owner of Del Camino Courts and founder of the Del Camino Bullfight Museum which was the only one in the United States. He was a well known big game hunter. He was founder and first president of the East El Paso Rotary Club, past District Governor of Rotary International, a Paul Harris Fellow and had helped found the Lower Valley Rotary Club and the Northeast Rotary Club.
