In Old El Paso—25 yrs ago
June 14, 1927

In Old El Paso—25 yrs ago
July 19, 1927

Afraid to go to court, prisoners frequently hide in the County Jail. That is what **Mrs. Maria T. Tobias**, jailer, told Constable W.A. Simpson while Simpson was searching for a prisoner whose employer wanted to pay his fine.

In Old El Paso—10 yrs ago
November 28, 1942

Two El Paso men, **William L. Tobias** and William B. Williamson Jr., completed training in the Medical Administrative Corps Officer Candidate School at Camp Barkley, and received their commissions as second lieutenants.
