New Auditorium, Rooms Scheduled For Burnet School

By mid-winter, Burnet Elementary School is scheduled to become a "regular school," with a full school day for all students, but until then it must limp along on double sessions, split into two divisions of students.

That's because Burnet School, located at 3700 Thomason avenue, north of William Beaumont Army Hospital, is a rapidly-growing school and is being doubled in classroom size.

Twelve new rooms are being added, together with cafeteria, auditorium and offices for the principal and clerk. The addition is due for completion by Jan. 15. The expansion project will cost \$257,000.

Has 18 on Faculty

The principal of Burnet School is Lamar Taylor. He was principal of Travis School, as well as Burnet, last year, but gives full time to Burnet this year. Mrs. Mary Crum is Burnet School clerk.

Last year, Burnet School had a faculty of eight, including Mrs. Crum. This year, Burnet has a faculty of 18, including the principal and clerk.

Burnet had a makeshift cafeteria last year. The kitchen occupied what was intended as the teachers' lounge. Two classrooms, with partition left out, served as the cafeteria dining room.

Students Eat at Home

But the building program eliminated even the makeshift cafeteria this year. The double sessions make it unnecessary for students to bring lunches, for those who get out early can go home for lunch, and the second session children can eat before they go to school.

Mrs. Jessie Burns, manager of the cafeteria, is employed at the Coldwell Elementary School cafeteria until the Burnet School addition is completed.

The school day for the morning group starts at 8:30 a. m. and ends at noon. The afternoon group starts at 12 noon and continues to 3:30 p. m.

Each classroom has two teachers, the morning teacher giving way at noon to the afternoon teacher.

A large percentage of Burnet students are children of Ft. Bliss military personnel. Buses transport the children to and from the school.
