Jim Peak

2017 Hall of Honor Inductee

James M. "Jim" Peak is often referred to as one of America's "deans of fundraising." He possesses 31 years of extensive and successful fundraising experience for health care institutions, higher education institutions, religious organizations, museums, and other non-profit organizations across

the United States. Prior to his retirement, Mr. Peak successfully led major fundraising campaigns in 22 states for non-profit organizations like the El Paso Lighthouse for the Blind (\$22 million), Montana Tech University in Butte, Montana (\$21 million); Diocese of Spokane, Washington; (\$3.5 million), and the Salvation Army in Omaha, Nebraska. (\$8.3 million).

Between 1989 and 1991, Mr. Peak was employed as President of Providence Memorial Foundation in El Paso, where he established a new fundraising program for the hospital. Just two years after the foundation's formation, Mr. Peak raised over \$1.5 million from individual and corporate donors and



created two endowments valued at more than \$1 million and four charitable reminder trusts valued at \$2 million.

From 1977 to 1989, Mr. Peak served The University of Texas at El Paso, his alma mater, as Chief Development Officer. During his tenure, he developed a team that increased annual giving ten-fold (from \$400,000 per year to \$5 million per year), enlarged the university's permanent endowment by \$25 million, and successfully raised the funds to endow a new \$50 million library building and fill it with books.

At the international level, Mr. Peak has severed on the Association of Fundraising Professionals Membership Committee (2005-2007), the Committee on Directorship (2006-2008), and the Outstanding Professional Award Selection Committee (2007).

He remains an active volunteer in the El Paso community as a member of the Downtown Lions Club, the El Paso County Historical Society (where he served as president in 1977), and the American Cancer Society (West Texas and State of Texas).

Don Henderson's legacy encompasses decades of service to the people of El Paso. Mr. Henderson ran for alderman and was elected in 1973. He served as the Parks, Recreation and Health alderman during this time. He was responsible for overseeing the following projects: construction of Pavo Real Park and Pool in the Lower Valley, the new pool at Washington Park, and the pool at Westside Park. He also supervised construction on Travis White Park (East El Paso) and Ponder Park (West El Paso). As an alderman, Mr.
