July 28, 1884

The police court today was unusually busy. Many were fined for petty offenses against the city laws. The cases against La Maise for failure to pay his occupation tax was threshed out, the trial taking several hours and resulting in the defendant being dismissed. **Mike Kelley** paid \$7.00 for fighting, while Henry Quarles paid a like sum for knocking down one of our fellow citizens. A citizen from the "Flower King-

dom" carried a six shooter and was taxed \$30.

Glimpses Into the Past.—30 yrs ago
September 26, 1884

Mr. Henry Kelley is up from Camp Rice and reports that the fall round-up is in full swing in that section. He states that over 20,000 head of cattle will be shipped from there this fall. **Mr. Kelley** predicts that El Paso will soon be leading cattle shipping point of the southwest.

December 6, 1884

Tomorrow morning the regular train of the Santa Fe road will take El Pasoans who will accompany the local baseball club to the neighboring town of Las Cruces. The following team has been selected: Hibler, Edwards, Speck, Hart, **Kelly**, McCloskey, A. Hart, Devereaux, Angles, Aaron, Berrien, Sullivan, Reis, Fink, Hutchinson, Rarey, Roberts.

December 14, 1884

At the meeting of the hook and ladder company of the fire department, Mr. Vansisk was elected president unanimously, while Assistant Foreman **Dan Kelly** and Treasurer Kinne were re-elected without a dissenting voice.

August 23, 1889

Alderman Kelly let the contract to Momsen & Thorne to bore five wells for the city. One of these was commenced in the plaza close to the fountain.

Out Of The Past—40 Years Ago
September 5, 1889

The constitutional convention is fairly launched at Santa Fe. The conspicuous and active members of the convention are: Mariano Otero, J. Francisco Chavez, and Trinidad Romero, who have represented New Mexico in congress; Thomas B. Catron and W.P. Clancy, prominent attorneys of Santa Fe; Judge W.C. Hazeldine, Pedro Perea and E.S. Stover, of Albuquerque, the latter formerly lieutenant governor of Kansas; A.J. Fountain, formerly lieutenant governor of Texas; and W.L. Rynerson, of Dona Ana, Judge Bail and Ex-Associate Justice Briston of Silver City; **Judge Kelly** and Ex-Governor and Secretary W.R. Ritch, of Socorro; Geo. W. Pitchart, attorney; and Jefferson Raynolds, banker and capitalist of Las Vegas and Nicholas Galles, of Sierra, Judge Trimble of Albuquerque, temporary chairman, was formerly a member of congress from Kentucky.

Out Of The Past—40 Years Ago
September 6, 1889

The senate irrigation committee headed by the Hon. W.M. Stewart, chairman, of Nevada, and accompanied by Major J.W. Powell, chief of the U.S. Geological Survey, and a large staff, arrived here by special train of the Southern Pacific today. They were met by a committee of the city council consisting of Aldermen True, Davis, Kitchen, Solomon, Merrick and **Kelly**. In the citizens' committee were E.B. Bronson, Col. Anson Mills, Judge Magoffin, W.S. McCutcheon, and Judges Davis and Crosby. The senate committee held a hearing at the city hall on the possibility of irrigating the Rio Grande valley. Col. Mills, in his speech, said the

Mills dam, as proposed, would cost about \$220,000 and would irrigate 120,000 acres in Mexico and nearly as much on this side. The committee is to meet again this evening.

Time indeed works wonders. Only a few weeks ago **Alderman Kelly** was a pronounced Republican but today he is such a good Democrat that Grandma Tribune sits at his feet and drinks in the grand Jeffersonian principles enunciated by him.

Out Of The Past—40 Years Ago
September 6[7], 1889

The following conversation between Mayor Caples and **Alderman Kelly** explains why the former did not meet the irrigation committee yesterday: "Hello. Dick. Why have you got on that new paper collar and that owlsh expression of countenance?" "Why, **Mr. Kelly**, the fact is, I thought I would meet the irrigation committee and tender them the freedom of the city." "Well, you can go home, take off that collar and compose your countenance. You can't meet the committee today. When Alderman Johnson left town, he left me, the next best Democrat in the council, in charge of you."

Out Of The Past—40 Years Ago
September 19, 1889

City Council met last night with Mayor Caples, Alderman True, Merrick, Kitchen, **Kelly** and Solomon present. J.A. Smith, as one of the signers of the petition for the removal of officers Dowd and Guiberson, asked the council to appoint a lawyer to conduct the case, as Judge Chandler had left the city. Simon Mike and E. Moye testified to the assault on Zack White by officer Dowd at the First National bank.

The three El Paso papers, says the Laredo Gate City, are in a squabble over the awarding of the city printing to The Times. Why don't the two disappointed ones come out

boldly, and say, "No first class paper would have the city printing, anyhow." The Herald doesn't care a rap about the city printing. It has a kick against **Alderman Kelly**, however, for voting with the Democrats and giving the printing to a Democratic paper when he was elected as a Republican.

Out Of The Past—40 Years Ago
October 1, 1889

Dan Kelly (Democrat) to Mayor Caples (Democrat): "Dickey, I hear that the new collector is going to discharge all Democrats in the custom house and put Republicans in their places. Too bad, ain't it?" Dickey: "He can't do it. I'll veto it."

Out Of The Past—40 Years Ago
October 25, 1889

A butcher named **Kelly** and a clerk in a store at San Pedro was in a playful scuffle at that place Wednesday, a pistol was accidentally discharged, wounding **Kelly** in the abdomen, from which he died yesterday morning at 2:15. No blame attaches to the clerk other than carelessness.

Out Of The Past—40 Years Ago
December 12, 1889

Last evening belonged to the firemen, and they were out in their uniforms in full force at the city hall. Officers for the ensuing years are: Hon. John Julian, unanimously reelected president; S.H. Buchanan, vice-president; A.G. Foster, second vice-president; W.S. Hills, third vice-president; and J.H. White, fourth vice president. W.H. Tuttle was elected chief, J.M. Connors assistant chief, **Dan Kelly** treasurer, and J.P. O'Connor secretary

April 1, 1890

A young alderman arrived at the residence of **Dan Kelly**, on San Antonio street, this

morning. It is the first born. Mother and child are doing nicely.

14 Years Ago In El Paso
April 20, 1890

The city council meets with Mayor Caples in the chair and assigns the following committees of the new council: Finance, Papin, Dieter and Davis; street and grades, Solomon, Davis and **Kelley**; taxation, **Kelley**, Dieter and Solomon; police, Dieter, Papin and **Kelley**; fire and water, Magoffin, Merrick and Kingsbury; acequia, Herrick, Magoffin and Papin. The council also approves the appointment of A.F. Stacy as city scavenger.

Out Of The Past—40 yrs ago
May 10, 1890

City council was to have met last night, but owing to there being a show in town only Mayor Caples and Aldermen **Kelly** and Dieter showed up. Dieter moved that they adjourn until Monday evening. **Kelly** seconded it and the motion prevailed.

14 Years Ago In El Paso
May 11 [12], 1890

Only Mayor Caples and Aldermen **Kelly** and Dieter show up at the council meeting, owing to a show at the opera house.

14 Years Ago In El Paso
June 17, 1890

The city council passes an ordinance recommended by police committee, consisting of Chairman J.W. Magoffin, George Papin and **Dan Kelley**, firing every officer on the force, including Chief Lyons for alleged incompetency and other charges.

Out Of The Past—40 yrs ago
June 28, 1890

High L. Kelly, ex-commissioner of Presidio county, who is in the city en route to Chicago, states that there is a corps of engineers

now in the field near Fort Davis locating a line for a road from Pecos City south to Fort Davis and Marfa.

The police petition came up before the council last evening. Alderman Papin moved that it be rejected without being read: **Alderman Kelly** seconded the motion.

July 1, 1890

Mrs. B. Kelley, wife of a well-known ranchman near Valentine, dies at her home.

August 25, 1890

News reached the city yesterday that the great **Kelly mine** at **Kelly, N.M.**, was afire. The mine is heavily timbered and it is feared that it will be completely ruined.

The police committee composed of Aldermen Magoffin, Papin and **Kelley** resumed the hearing of evidence last night in the case of Captain Chas. B. Dowd, of the police force, who is charged with unnecessary violence to a prisoner while taking the latter to jail.

14 Years Ago In El Paso
December 30, 1890

The police committee, consisting of alderman Magoffin, Papin and **Kelley** air the charges made against captain Dowd by chief of police Lyons. Dowd is accused of gambling, but claims that Lyons is merely after his scalp. No decision is reached.

14 Years Ago In El Paso
January 5, 1891

The police committee holds a meeting in conjunction with mayor Caples, but as **alderman Kelly** is absent no business is done.

Glimpses Of The Past—24 yrs ago
January 25, 1891

Mayor Caples, Aldermen Dieter, **Kelley**, Papin and Solomon, and Messrs. True, Russell, Z.T. White, Buchanan and Stanton held a meeting at the city hall for the purpose of drafting certain amendments to the city charter, to be submitted at the legislature in session at the state capital.

February 21, 1891

At a meeting of the city council the quarterly report of City Treasurer Fasset was received and filed. Those present at the meeting were Mayor Caples, Aldermen Davis, Dieter, **Kelley**, Merrick, Magoffin and Solomon.

March 13, 1891

It was rumored that **Dan Kelly's** friends in the second ward will insist on him being a candidate for re-election. Judge Townsend was named as a probable aldermanic candidate for the fourth ward. The city election was set for April 14.

Glimpses Of The Past—24 yrs ago

March 29, 1891

Pursuant to call issued by Mayor Caples, the city council held a special session. Those present at the meeting were Mayor Caples and Aldermen Davis, Dieter, Magoffin, Papin, **Kelly** and Solomon. The street and grade committee recommended that the bid of William Caples be accepted for putting down a crossing at the corner of El Paso and San Antonio streets. Warrants were ordered drawn for the city payroll for March, amounting to \$1,733.34.

The city council met in regular session with the following present: Mayor Caples, Aldermen Davis, Dieter, Magoffin, Merrick, **Kelly**, Papin and Solomon. The weekly payroll of the newer commissioner was approved.
